

2008 Asia-Pacific Homeland Security Summit Fellows Program

Eligibility: Applicants should be either 1) students currently enrolled in a degree or certificate program at an accredited U.S. or foreign college or university or 2) company-grade U.S. military officers (O-1 through O-3) on active duty, National Guard or Reserve status.

Period of Fellowship: October 7-10, 2008. Fellow meetings and presentations will be scheduled the afternoon of Tuesday, October 7th and throughout the conference days on Oct 8th through 10th.

Financial Scholarship: The fellowship program will cover the Fellow's conference registration, which includes conference presentations and breakout sessions, conference materials and meals. Fellows are responsible for their own transportation and lodging.

Opportunities: To learn about homeland security from international experts, meet industry leaders and see the latest technology. All meetings and presentations will be in English.

Paper: Each Fellow will write a 3 – 5 page paper (double-spaced) about an assigned conference session. Upon satisfactory completion, the paper will be posted on the conference website. Deadline for completed paper submission is October 31, 2008.

1. Completed and signed application form
2. One letter of recommendation from a college professor or military supervisor
3. For student applicants: a graded paper, at least 3 pages long, which was submitted for a class
For military applicants: a decision paper, at least 2 pages long, which was submitted for work
3. Military officers must submit written approval from their commanding officer to apply and permission to attend the entire conference, if chosen

By September 8, 2008,

1. Electronically submit a color photo which will be used on the conference website if you are chosen as a Fellow (not more than 500 KBytes) to summit@scd.hawaii.gov
2. Electronically submit a short profile (bio) which will be used on the conference website if you are chosen as a Fellow (not more than 75 words) to summit@scd.hawaii.gov

Application packets must be postmarked no later than 4:30 pm on September 8, 2008.

Your photo and profile must be received or your application will not be considered.

Successful applicants will be notified via telephone and email no later than September 19, 2008.
